

Full Modules (B1, B2 & B1.3)

AERONEST provides EASA Part 66 Basic Examination in partnership with Aviotrace Swiss approved 147 training organizations from FOCA Switzerland. Our full module covers all required learning sections categorized for EASA Part 66 B1.1, B1.3 and B2 License.

EASA PART 66 AML Courses

FULL COURSE

Here are several categories of license which cover different levels and disciplines and a variety of paths exist to achieve them.

CATEGORY A LICENSE is required to attain after graduation from a 2-year approved course and after 2 years of appropriate practical experience.

CATEGORY B LICENSES are further divided into specialist skills such as Mechanical (B1) or Avionic (B2).

SELF-STUDY is the alternative path to get this license, attending short courses and examinations (read more on the EASA Part-66 Examinations page). In this case, 5 years of appropriate practical experience is required.

SHORT MODULAR COURSES

Our short courses are full-time courses for students with no previous study of the module, to be well prepared for the exam on the final day. The course fee includes all study materials, tuition, revision support, exam, and 2nd attempt.

What is EASA Part 66 and why the Certificate of Recognition is required?

Part 66 is basically, specific dedicated sections within the Regulation in which EASA establishes the standards/ conditions under which engineer maintenance authorized to release an aircraft into service after a maintenance operation.

To obtain the Part 66 Basic Aircraft Maintenance Engineer License (AMEL), the candidate should fulfill the two most important prerequisites defined in EASA Part-66 Regulations.



BASIC KNOWLEDGE REQUIREMENTS (PART 66.A.25)

An applicant for Basic PART-66 Aircraft Maintenance License or the addition of a category or subcategory, shall demonstrate a level of knowledge in the appropriate subject modules in accordance with Appendix I, by the basic knowledge examinations which is conducted by a training organization appropriately approved under EASA Part-147 Regulations.

The Certificate of Recognition CoR is given to the candidate upon successful completion of the examination.








REQUIREMENTS

- operating aircraft if the applicant has no previous relevant technical training.
- ▶ 3 years of practical maintenance experience on operating aircraft and completion of training considered relevant by the competent authority as a skilled worker in a technical trade.
- ▶ 2 years of practical maintenance experience on operating aircraft and completion of a Part -147 approved basic training course.

Aircraft groups are described in 66.A.5.

These schemes do not override Part-66 requirements nor capture all the possibilities (various licenses, education, and experiences). The start and end of each phase can vary depending on individual cases.

Why you should issue the **COR and Part 66 AMEL** from EASA Members?



An AML issued by a country other than the **EASA Member States** cannot be rendered valid as EASA Part-66 AML.



Part-66 licenses issued by countries other than the EASA Member States are not mutually recognized in the European system.



EXAMINATION

Examination service is available in 3 different ways

Access to online training manual

The delegates who have registered for the Exam, will be granted access to the online Study Material until the day of that Examination

4-7 hours of Online classroom lecture (Review)

the delegates who have registered for the Exam will obtain a Review session before the examination. The review session will be delivered by Aviotrace Swiss-approved instructor through an online platform.

Participation in the exam session

The Part 66 examinations are based on the Part 66 syllabus as set out in Appendix I to Part 66. Part 66 theoretical knowledge and examination requirements employ a modular syllabus, each module may vary in terms of the subject and category, and complexity of License sought.

Free second attempt

in case of a failed exam, a second attempt will be scheduled and provided for each module in the same location FREE OF CHARGE.
